**Title:** The Holy Spirit Changes Everything

*“Don't chase yesterday's miracle—let the Holy Spirit do something new in you today.”*

## ***Introduction***

This week, pray daily for a fresh move of the Holy Spirit in your life and be open to the new miracles He wants to do.

**Are you longing for an old miracle, coveting someone else's, or ready to be the epicentre of God's next move?**

Pastor Dom O'Connell reminded us that the journey with Jesus and the early Church was always marked by movement and miracles, but never by staying stuck in the past. We often want to revisit old miracles or compare our journey with others, but God's Spirit has something new for each of us here and now.

Instead of chasing after what God did before or what He's doing elsewhere, we're called to embrace the Holy Spirit's presence within us. Now, every believer is the epicentre of God's activity—wherever we go, the Spirit goes with us! As we approach Pentecost, let's prepare our hearts for a fresh outpouring, expectant that God will move in new and powerful ways.

## ***Scripture***

Acts 1:14 — All these with one accord continued steadfastly in prayer and supplication, along with the women, and Mary the mother of Jesus, and with his brothers.



Acts 2:1-4 — Now when the day of Pentecost had come, they were all with one accord in one place.

John 20 — Now on the first day of the week, Mary Magdalene went early, while it was still dark, to the tomb, and saw the stone taken away from the tomb.

John 21 — After these things, Jesus revealed himself again to the disciples at the sea of Tiberias. He revealed himself this way.

Acts 3 — Peter and John were going up into the temple at the hour of prayer, the ninth hour.
